Clackamas Community College: The main campus is located in Oregon City Oregon. Students are able to choose from several programs of study as they pursue a 2-year degree or acquire transferable credits as they look towards a 4-year degree.

George Fox University: is Oregon's nationally recognized Christian university, providing students with personal attention, global opportunities to learn and serve, and a supportive community that encourages academic rigor and spiritual growth.

Linfield College: is a private, comprehensive, undergraduate institution located in the Pacific Northwest, connects the traditional liberal arts with a practically-based education through collaborative, service and experiential learning opportunities. Linfield is nationally recognized for its strong teaching faculty, outstanding academic programs and distinctive international emphasis. Linfield educates students to become global citizens, with more than half of all graduates participating in study aboard courses

Mt. Hood Community College: Community colleges offer a variety of classes and two-year degrees. One of the advantages is that they cost much less than 4-year colleges. Most classes will be transferable to a 4-year university, but many students can enter the work force with a 2-year degree.

Portland Community College: has several campuses throughout the Portland metro area. Students are able to choose from several programs of study as they pursue a 2-year degree or acquire transferable credits as they look towards a 4-year degree.

Portland State University: is the largest university in Oregon and is located in SW Portland. Here, students work towards a 4-year degree and may choose from many programs of study. On campus housing is available while many students also live off campus and commute to school. It is readily accessed using the light rail. Many graduate programs are available to students after completing 4-year degree.

University of Portland: is a private catholic university located in NE Portland. Students work towards a 4-year degree and may choose from many programs of study. On campus housing is available while many students also live off campus and commute to school. Many graduate programs are available to students after completing 4-year degree.

Warner Pacific College: students can choose from 27 majors and 29 minors, and students pursuing a graduate education can select one of three graduate studies degrees, including Master of Education, Master of Teaching, and Master of Science in Management/Organizational Leadership.

Western Oregon University: is a public liberal arts college located in Monmouth Oregon (15 miles SW of Salem). Students work towards a 4-year degree and may choose from many programs of study. On campus housing is available as students typically live on campus. Many graduate programs are available to students after completing 4-year degree.
