Objective: Public speaking(presenting a commercial), interpreting visual symbols. Acknowledging individual tastes and styles.

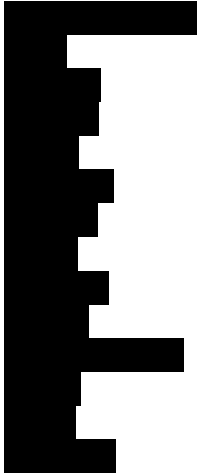
Group Relay

Objective: Reflection on community, taking time for individual expression, making decisions about how to present ideas.

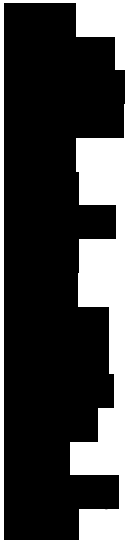
Trash Pickup

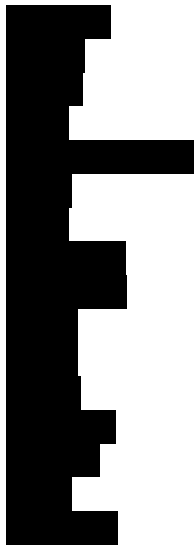
Outdoor Games

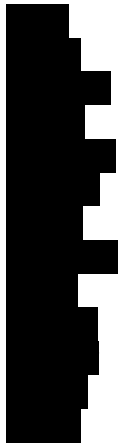
